Trinity Friends In Community,

Seminary does not teach pastors all that they need to know. In the last few months, I learned of a church holiday I have overlooked for years and now that I know it matters, I *must* tell you about it. At the end of the season of Epiphany comes Candlemas, historically observed February 2. Sometimes referred to as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus, Candlemas marks the event when Jesus is brought by Mary and Joseph to the Temple, forty days after His birth, and where Simeon and Anna recognize Him as the long-awaited Messiah, “a light for revelation to the Gentiles.”

The Christian Tradition has marked this day by blessing candles and carrying them in procession, then taking them home to be lit throughout the year. These candles were not merely symbolic. They were a confession of faith, that Christ’s light does not remain in the sanctuary, but goes with God’s people into their daily lives, into times of joy and hardship, into moments of prayer, uncertainty, and hope.

Candlemas may feel distant from our modern rhythms, yet its message is especially needed today. We live in a world that constantly tells us that redemption can be achieved through human effort, political power, social progress, or individual self-creation. Even good and necessary work can quietly become a burden when we begin to believe that everything depends on us.

Candlemas gently reminds us otherwise.

The Kingdom of God does not arrive through force or brilliance. It arrives quietly, humbly, and faithfully. Jesus enters the Temple not as a ruler, but as a child carried in His mother’s arms. He is recognized not by the powerful, but by those who have learned to wait, to watch, and to trust God’s promises. The light of the Kingdom is received before it is ever carried.

Later, Jesus tells His disciples, “You are the light of the world.” This is not a command to generate our own light or to save the world by our own strength. It is a statement of identity rooted in grace. We are light because Christ, the true Light, has come near.

For us at Trinity, Candlemas offers both comfort and challenge. It comforts us by reminding us that God’s work does not depend entirely on our efforts. The light has already come. The Kingdom of God is already among us. And it challenges us by inviting us to participate, to be attentive to what God is doing right now, in ordinary places, through ordinary faithfulness.

My prayer is that we might be a people who learn again how to receive the light before trying to produce it, and who carry that light gently into our homes, our community, and our life together as a church. In a world searching for illumination, may we trust that Christ's light is already in our hands, and that God is faithfully at work among us.

Through **Heifer International**, these gifts—along with agricultural and values-based training—are helping families around the world build lasting self-sufficiency.
- Scholarship funds sent **two children** to church camp to grow in faith and friendship.
- **\$1,200** contributed to AVAC to support their mission work in our community.


~Cluck Cluck Give a BUCK~

FINANCE MATTERS

Trinity's Administrative Council, working with the Finance Committee passed a working budget of \$153,188 for the 2026 operating account. This breaks down to \$2,945 needed each week. To help fund this budget a grant has been received from the conference to help pay Pastor Zack's salary. There are also several designated funds that provide additional support for some church expenses not included in these totals.

\$9,950 is budgeted for Administration. This covers our office supplies and equipment, postage for mailings other than the newsletter, the cost of making copies for services, education, reports, etc. This amount also handles social security, Medicare and workers compensation for our employees, payroll service costs, website fees, workers' compensation, and donations to EMS.

While Pastor Zack and his family have chosen not to live in the parsonage, we still own the home. The Trustees are working with the conference to get the house sold. Because we don't know when that will happen, we have included expenses for utilities, taxes and maintenance in the budget, which total \$6,500.

We estimate \$30,000 will be needed to pay utility bills for the church. This includes electricity, gas, water, sewage, cable, and Internet. \$4,500 of the operating budget is allocated for maintenance and repairs of the church. An additional \$9,000 will be needed for property insurances. Grounds, lawn care, snow removal and custodial supplies require \$2750.

Pastor Zack's salary is set at the conference minimum for a Provisional Member with 3 churches at \$44,151. In lieu of living in the parsonage, he receives a housing allowance of \$1,500. The conference health insurance and pension contributions are set at \$19,509.48. Pastor also receives reimbursement of his expenses up to \$6,000. All these expenses are split equally between Bairdford, Janes and Trinity.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee has recommended a salary freeze for the organist, and treasurer. Those salaries are set at \$12,000 music director/organist and \$2,678 treasurer. The custodian had an increase in hours worked so his salary increases to \$10,060.

We also pay "apportionments" to the Western Pennsylvania Conference of the United Methodist Church. In 2025, we were unable to pay 100% of our share of the apportionments. We pray that we will be able to improve our share in 2026, paying a larger percentage of the amount that the conference requests. Our support of the conference enables us to participate in the broad ministry and mission of the United Methodist Church. But the conference also provides local support. As stated above, the conference has awarded the charge a grant to help pay Pastor Zack's salary. The conference has set our portion of their budget at \$17,230.

The budget for church programs is set at \$4800. This is an increase from 2025. A line item of \$1,000 was added to assist the visitation team in their ministry. Additionally, this money covers diverse areas within the church such as education, missions, support of AVAC, hospitality, licenses required to project words on the screen, perform music, and stream our service online, and other worship materials.

While we have paid off two previous loans, we still have the outstanding roof loan. The yearly payments on this loan for 2026 totals \$18,000.

Your offerings contributed to fund this budget are truly appreciated.
