A Blessing of Generosity

It is with immense gratitude and joy that the Endowment Committee share an extraordinary blessing that has recently been bestowed upon our congregation. Trinity UM has received a remarkable donation of \$698,735, generously gifted through the will of one of our members, Charles W. Voskamp.

This generous act is a testament to his and his wife Joan’s deep faith, enduring love for our church community, and their commitment to ensuring our mission continues to thrive for generations to come.

The Endowment Committee and Administrative Council prayerfully discerned how best to utilize this incredible gift to honor the donor's legacy and glorify God. Initial decisions included:

- Repayment of the \$13,695 loan from the Western PA Conference that paid for Pastor Greg’s health care when Trinity was unable to make the payments.
- Investing \$10,000 with the UM Foundation to establish the Charles and Joan Voskamp post-secondary education scholarship.
- Contribution of \$600,000 to our current endowment fund invested with the UM Foundation for long-term sustainability and future ministry growth.
- Depositing \$75,559 in a money market fund through the UM Foundation to be accessed for supporting renovations and improvements to our church facilities that have been on the backburner and expanding our outreach programs to better serve the needs of our local community.

We invite you to join us in celebrating this blessing and in praying for guidance as we steward this gift wisely.

This act of faith reminds us all of the power of legacy and the impact that a single family can have on many. May this gift inspire us to live generously, reflect on our own stewardship, and continue to build a vibrant, faith-filled community.

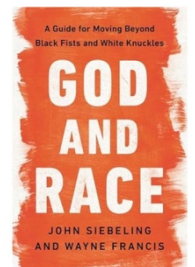

FINANCE MATTERS

Submitted by the Finance Committee

Trinity's Administrative Council, working with the Finance Committee passed a working budget of \$141,304 for the 2024 operating account. This is an increase of \$8,573 from the 2024 budget and breaks down to \$2,882 per week. To help fund this budget a grant has been received from the conference to help pay Pastor Diane's salary. There are also several designated funds that provide additional support for some church expenses not included in these totals.

\$9,601 is budgeted for Administration. This covers our office supplies and equipment, postage for mailings other than the newsletter, the cost of making copies for services, education, reports, etc. This amount also handles social security, Medicare and workers compensation for our employees, payroll service costs, website fees, workers' compensation, and donations to EMS.

We estimate \$32,404 will be needed to pay utility bills for the church and our share for the parsonage. This includes electricity, gas, water, sewage, cable, and Internet. \$4,167 of the operating budget is allocated for maintenance and repairs of the church and parsonage. Grace and Freeport will continue to contribute to the cost of the parsonage utilities and normal maintenance and repairs. An additional \$14,500 will be needed for property insurances and taxes. Grounds, lawn care, snow removal and custodial supplies require \$3,083.

Pastor Diane's salary is set at the conference minimum for a Provisional Member and remains at the 2024 amount of \$41,991. Although she receives Medicare, we are required to pay the conference health insurance and pension contributions that are set at \$20,283. Pastor also receives reimbursement of her expenses up to \$6,800. All these expenses are split equally between Freeport, Grace, and Trinity.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee has recommended a salary freeze for the organist, and treasurer. Those salaries are set at \$12,000 music director/organist and \$2,678 treasurer. The custodian had an increase in hours worked so his salary increases to \$10,060.

We also pay "apportionments" to the Western Pennsylvania Conference of the United Methodist Church. In 2024, we were unable to pay 100% of our share of the apportionments. We pray that we will be able to improve our share in 2025, paying a larger percentage of the amount that the conference requests. Our support of the conference enables us to participate in the broad ministry and mission of the United Methodist Church. But the conference also provides local support. In 2023, the conference loaned Trinity over \$18,000 for the cost of Pastor Greg's health care and pension when we were unable to pay. We made the final interest free payment in January. As stated above, the conference also has awarded the charge to help pay Pastor Diane's salary. The conference has set our portion of their budget at \$15,724.

The budget for church programs is set at \$3,635. This covers diverse areas within the church such as education, support of AVAC, hospitality, licenses required to project words on the screen, perform music, and stream our service online, and other worship materials.

While we have paid off two previous loans, we still have the outstanding roof loan. The yearly payments on this loan for 2025 totals \$18,000.

Your offerings contributed to fund this budget are truly appreciated.

Trinity United Methodist Church Brackenridge has been contacted, and has been approved by our Board of Trustees, to provide our facility to be used for the training and testing of individuals for positions as “County Certified Food Handler Supervisors.”

This training and testing for Certification will be conducted by Allegheny County Health Department personnel on Tuesday May 20, 2025. (I have been told that an issued Certification provided is valid for a term of five (5) years.)

Please be aware, it is my understanding, that in Allegheny County at least one (1) “Certified Food Handler” is required to be present at any function involving the preparation or dispensing of food even Church organizations.

There has been provided, by the ACHD, a small number of complimentary registration forms as compensation for use of our facility.

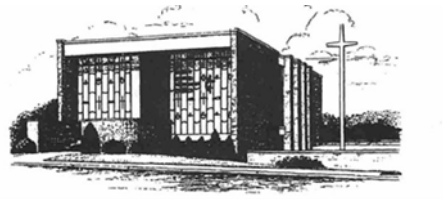
