Open or Closed?

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, TUMC has been forced, first and foremost by its concern for the health and safety of everyone who might pass through the church doors and by its legal and moral obligation to follow the guidelines of the Center for Disease Control, and the state of Pennsylvania:

- to cancel most on site activities (i.e. Youth Group, Artists Group, Girl Scouts, etc.)
- to obtain permission to meet from the Trustees (contact Bill Barnett at 724-224-7777)
- to register attendees, take their temperatures, require mask wearing, remain 6 feet apart from any other non-family person, and use hand sanitizer.

Although the coronavirus has forced us to change our lives in ways we could never have imagined, it has also given us the opportunity to find new ways of worshipping, celebrating our faith and reaching out.

It has motivated us to find more effective ways of sharing our beliefs and expressing our love. It has inspired us to care for each other and to be more caring.

It has also encouraged us to find new ways to meet, such as via ZOOM meetings (see below) where people can enjoy a lively exchange of ideas.

One of our most exciting “adaptations” is to offer spiritually uplifting concerts known as “Refresh” events, where musicians have the opportunity to perform and where people have the opportunity to relax and refresh their minds, souls and spirits.

Upcoming events include: Gospel music, Blues, Jazz, Bluegrass, Rock and Roll, and more (COVID and weather permitting). We hope God will bless and help us witness while helping the community through our outreach and love.

FROM THE PASTOR



Gregory L. Spencer has served as pastor at Trinity United Methodist Church since June of 2016 and has lead the church through a series of trials and tribulations, including but not limited to major roof repairs, HVAC installations, boiler replacement, water leaks and asbestos removal.

His goal is to reach out to the community through events designed to provide entertainment, enjoyment and the friendly fellowship this church is known for.

Designated Funds: A Sacred Trust

One of the most sacred and responsible ministries of a church is to hold in highest value the way it cares for monies entrusted to it for the service of God, people, and the world. In our book of law (“The Discipline of The United Methodist Church”), it clearly directs that the church is to honor the intent of the donor and use funds donated to the purposes for which the funds were given.

The Finance Committee and, subsequently, the Administrative Council has adopted a new strict policy and procedure for handling specific funds of Trinity Church. First, we have adopted several specific, church authorized designated funds. Each of these funds has a specific purpose. Some are designed to meet long-term goals, others to meet more immediate needs.

Example 1: one of our Church Sponsored funds is Capital Improvement Fund. This fund is established to raise funds for major capital projects over time. We have recently discovered that to replace the church roof costs many thousands of dollars. We have a reasonable expectation that we will enjoy 20 + years before we need to again replace our roof. Therefore, ongoing donations to the Capital Improvement Fund will make the burden of that cost much less difficult for future generations.

Example 2: A short term ministry fund is the Camp Scholarship Fund. Funds given for this purpose provide scholarships to families to help send children to good, Christian summer camp programs. Scholarships are needed on an annual basis, so funds raised through the year will build, but will be used, as needed, on an annual basis.

We are creating a savings account for the designated funds to insure that monies given to these sponsored, specific funds, shall not be used for any other purpose than that for which the money was given. From this point forward, our value is not to spend money that is not at our discretion to spend. Put simply, designated funds are not our monies and are not to be used for current expenses.

Perpetual Gifts: The Trinity Church Endowment Fund

Wouldn't it be nice to make a financial gift to the church that you pay only once but that helps the church and its ministry every year throughout the future of the church?

The Finance Committee and Administrative Council have adopted the policy and procedure that anyone may give to the church endowment fund, in any amount, at any time. NOW, anyone and everyone may contribute to the future ministry and financial strength of the church and know that his gifts will go immediately and directly to the endowment fund.

Did you know that, thanks to our Endowment Fund, we were able to get the loan for the replacement of the roof at 1/3 the interest rate of any bank? This alone saves the church \$40,000 dollars or more over the length of the

loan.

Did you know the church receives a dividend check from our Endowment Fund every three months, to help in cost and provision of projects to improve and expand our ministries?

No individual or group may expend or eliminate this permanent fund of the church, so the gifts that are contributed always honor the intent of the donor - to provide for the perpetual future of the church and our ministry.

We Give, Because We Love!

No one gives time, attention, energy or effort, much less money, if they do not care. The church, charity, ministry and mission does not depend upon those who do not care, but rather lives by those who love.

If people do not believe, they do not give. Without trust, or hope, confidence or faith, persons see no reason to give away that which matters so much to their lives and prosperity. And we of faith do not expect it of them. The last thing we need is a gift out of pressure or resentment.

Love is the sole source of the heart, mind, and spirit of people who believe and give to and for God, to and for Christ, and to and for each other, the community and the world. Some love their church, they love their ministries and memories, they love the people of faith from whom they learn, to whom they help, and with whom they live and love. Others love God in response to the love God or God's people have given to them. They love the help they have received and appreciate the care of the ones from whom that help came. Still others have learned the love of the Lord, not just for themselves, but for everyone around. These have discovered the joy we feel when we are able to bless and see the good it brings to the lives of those to whom we give. Finally, we give because we love the difference it makes. We give food to food banks because we love the joy the hungry gain when given a meal. We give to charities because we love the difference they make in lives and in the world, and love being a part of things that do so much good. We love to give because we love.

When you think of your life as an offering, you begin to see that we choose what we think and how, what we say, and how, what we value and why, and that love brings and multiplies the best results. When we love, and when we give in whatever way lives are touched, lives are improved, love grows, and God's kingdom comes. Thus, the more we love, the more we give, and the more we give, the more joy we gain, feel, and give. Praise the Lord!

We thank you for your offerings, with us, beside us, through us, for God, people, ministry and the world! May others join us in this holy and growing peace, love and joy. And may health and strength be restored and renewed swiftly in us and through us. We hope, pray, and love in Jesus' name.

“For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father’s family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this.” (Esther 4:14, NRSV)

“I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth.” (Isaiah 49:6 NRSV)

The whole world is caught in the grip of a worldwide pandemic. That means everyone, everywhere, is in danger from a worldwide disease known as Covid-19. Because you give TUMC was able to offer lunches and craft supplies to 11 children through our virtual story in the park program. Additionally, for families with children, the Education Team was able to provide spiritual booklets, puzzles and games to share and keep them connected to our congregation. We were able to provide Allegheny Valley hospital workers with snacks, food for overnight workers and masks. Because you give TUMC is able to provide a meeting place for Alcoholics Anonymous as well as space for Band Together Open Mic Events.

Because you give TUMC was able to provide a meal to the night shift at Allegheny Valley Hospital.

Because you donated masks and snacks TUMC was able to help meet a need at the hospital.

Because you give TUMC is able to contribute to the programs AVAC offers to our community:

Providing short-term emergency assistance to families and individuals, including emergency food, clothing and shoe vouchers, gasoline vouchers, bus passes, prescriptions, and shelter and meals to families experiencing homelessness. These are just a few of the services AVAC offers because of your donations.

In addition to AVAC, TUMC members contributed to Child Evangelism Fellowship (Kanawha Chapter) which evangelizes boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to establish them in the Word of God and in a local church for Christian living.

Because you give you participate in the ministry and mission of the United Methodist Church both locally and globally. Through TUMC's contributions to Connectional Apportionments we care for survivors recovering from hurricanes, floods and other storms; we invest, long term, in vulnerable communities; we address human rights and global health issues, implementing the most effective solutions to diseases like malaria; we equip people for ministry in local communities, and provide resources and guidance to help current clergy grow. We support United Methodist colleges and universities along with campus ministries in addition to 13 UM seminaries to train the next generation to lead our congregations. We advocate for justice related to changes in education, housing and welfare. In all of this, we share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Because you give we are able to offer programs, keep our facilities updated, and open our doors to other organizations, keeping our church alive in the community. 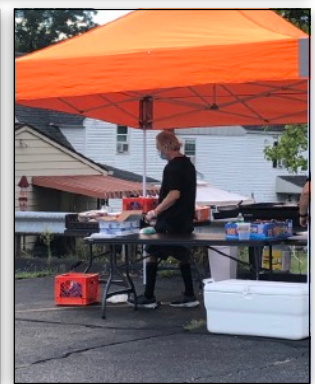
Although Tim has been besieged by an array of health problems in the last few years, he quickly stepped up to lead the PPR Committee when Pastor Greg asked.

THE CHURCH IN ACTION



GIVING TO THE CHURCH

As you may already know, the coronavirus pandemic has adversely affected many churches and ours is one of them. Not only has it prevented us from meeting and worshipping in the Sanctuary at the church, but also it has kept us from giving our money in the usual way - by placing it in the offering plate.

What that means is that we need to be giving more, giving often and giving generously.

Why should I give money to the church?

As a token of our appreciation, we should offer a gift back. As Jesus taught on the mount, “give and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you receive (Luke 6:38).”

How are my financial contributions put to use by the church?

The church budget—a public document—describes how funds donated to the church are used. The major expenses are: staff salaries (pastor, administrative assistant, treasurer, custodian, and music director); pastor’s benefits package; upkeep of the church building (utilities, insurance, and maintenance); and the ministries of the church (such as our local missions, education, etc.). Your money will be used where it is needed most.

How should I give to the church?

You may write a check or place cash in an envelope (*one* check, *one* envelope). If you’re paying for one week or 4 weeks, the rule is still the same - write one check and put that one check in a single envelope. Then

- put it in the offering plate
- mail it to TUMC or
- place it in the white drop box to the left of the doors into the office complex or
- put it in the black “wall” pocket on the church secretary’s office door or
- put it in the “Office” mailbox cubicle (to the left of the secretary’s office)

The envelope into which you put your contribution should have your name on it.

How can I contribute via Scrip?

By purchasing a gift card through SCRIP (see Colleen Rudolph), you will receive a gift card or gift cards of your choice (i.e. you will GET something) and, when you buy something with your gift card (which works the same way as paying with cash), the church will receive a percentage from the retailer of that card (i.e. you will GIVE the church something).

How can I set up an Electronic Funds Transfer?

Sending money directly from your bank account to the church’s bank account is simple. All you need is your “routing number” and “checking account number” and both of those are on your checks. Then, contact your bank and tell the customer service representative there that you would like to set up an EFT. He or she will then walk you through the steps in order to make that happen.



HOW TO USE GIVELIFY

GIVELIFY is the platform TUMC has chosen for its members and visitors to give to the church online, either via a downloadable app that can be set up on your Smart Phone or via your computer or tablet.

There is no cost for the giver to download and use the mobile giving app. GIVELIFY has:

No contracts

No signup fees

No monthly fees

No cancellation fees

For organizations, a transaction fee of 2.9% + \$.30 is charged per gift.

This small percentage is removed before the funds are disbursed to the organization; the remainder is automatically deposited into the organization's bank account on the next business day

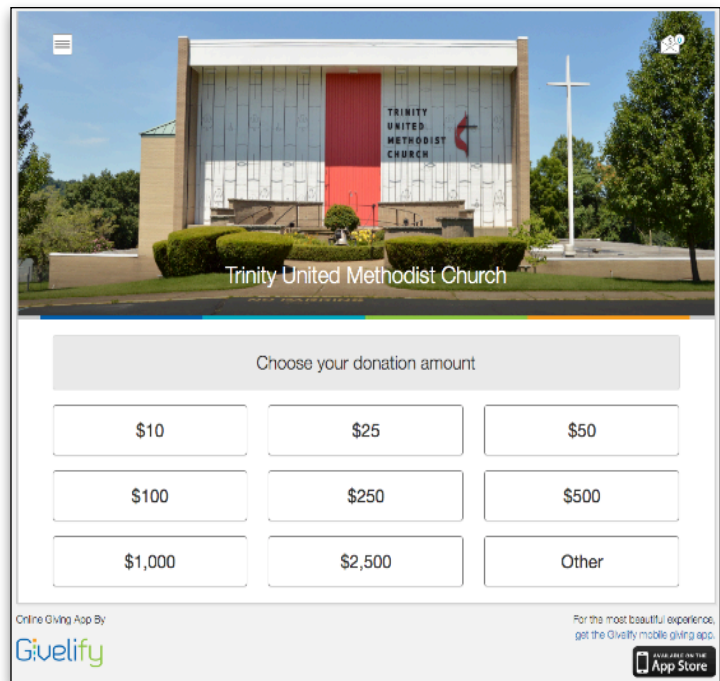
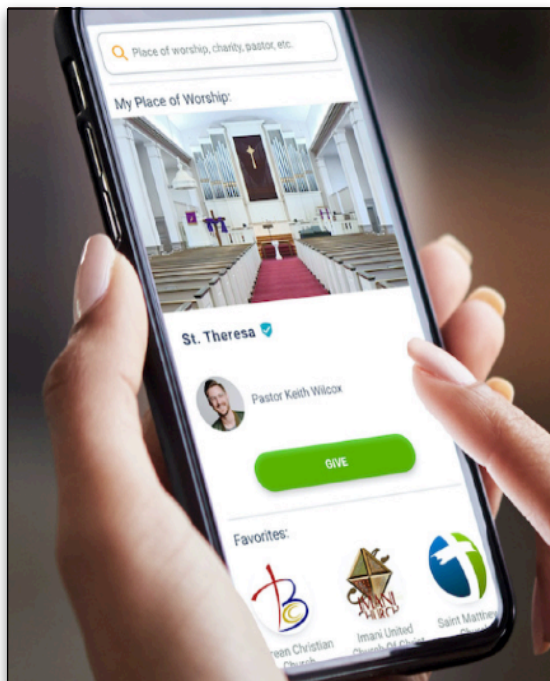
