As the UMC Book of Worship tells us, Christmas is a season of praise and thanksgiving for the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ, which begins with Christmas Eve (December 24 after sundown) or Day and continues through the Day of Epiphany. The name Christmas comes from the season's first service, the Christ Mass. Epiphany comes from the Greek word *epiphania*, which means "manifestation." New Year's Eve or Day is often celebrated in the United Methodist tradition with a Covenant Renewal Service. Signs of the season include a Chrismon tree, a nativity scene (include the magi on the Day of Epiphany), a Christmas star, angels, poinsettias, and roses. Gold, frankincense, myrrh, and three crowns are appropriate on the Day of Epiphany (January 6 or the Sunday nearest).

CHRISTMAS EVE

Dear Friends and Family of Trinity Church,

As of Thursday, November 19, Allegheny County is under a "Stay at Home" advisory, from the County Board of Health. Our primary concern, purpose, and mission as a faith community for Jesus Christ is to care for people. In the midst of the current health crisis, we must restrict public activity for the sake of containing the spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus.

Meetings, Studies, Activities

We are planning to provide a complete ONLINE Christmas Eve Service, available 9:00 AM Thursday, December 24, on website and Facebook pages.

We will use the church-wide call system to alert the congregation of any changes to status and plans, as quickly as possible.

Contending with Covid-19 - Update

Thanks to the members of the church and the groups who are being so faithful in following our protocols for mitigating the coronavirus. With the rise in cases and anxiety, we are adding steps to keep people safe and still minister with and to one another.

We believe the ministry of Jesus Christ is essential and will continue to plan and serve as best we can throughout the current health crisis and beyond. HOWEVER: please be aware, in the midst of changing circumstances, we may need to change plans and activities. Fortunately, we have the congregation call system to enable us to notify the church swiftly. Please make sure we have your name and phone number in the church office to ensure you receive our notifications. The church telephone number is 724-224-7300

The following are the current steps we are taking and asking all groups to support:

- Everyone who attends any activity at the church needs to wear protective face masks
- For contact tracing, everyone must **register attendance** upon entrance to the church.
- Everyone must have **temperature taken** upon entry. (99 degrees or higher, are not to enter)
- Everyone needs to hand sanitize upon entrance. (recommend sanitizing again on exit)
- All hard surfaces need to be wiped down with disinfectant after every event.
- Social distance (minimum 6 12 feet) must be maintained as much as possible
- We request any who come to display symptoms, **please contact any location or group** where you have been during the previous 10 14 days.

Every positive step we take may protect persons, even save lives.

We respect any who choose to stay home, stay safe, and avoid gathering in groups. Let us keep in contact through social media, email, and telephone. We care for each other.






Two ways the church communicates with people both within and without the church is via its online presence.


